

Who can enter the Book Review Competition?


The competition is open to students in **Years 2 to 6 who enrolled in Term 1 WEMT** course at Pre-Uni New College.


Prize for Winners

2026 Term 1 Book Review Competition - Rules & Conditions

1. This competition is open to Years 2 to 6 students who enrolled in the 2026 Term 1 WEMT course at Pre-Uni New College.
2. All book reviews must be based on the novel chosen from the **2026 Term 1 Novel List**, corresponding to each student's grade.
3. Students must submit their comprehensive book reviews via the '**Book Review Competition**' menu on [Cyberschool](#) no later than **Saturday, 25 April 2026**.
4. Participants are required to ensure the coherency of sentences, accurate spelling, proper use of grammar and punctuation, as well as the appropriate organisation of paragraphs in their reviews. Marks will be awarded solely to well-presented and completed reviews, adhering to the book review guidelines provided below:



❖ Year 2 Book Review Guidelines – The Story of Peter Pan

- Book Summary:
 - Introduce Peter Pan, the boy who can fly and never grows up.
 - Explain how he takes Wendy, John, and Michael to the magical world of Neverland.
 - Mention characters like Tinker Bell, the Lost Boys, and Captain Hook.
 - Finish by saying how they face dangers, defeat Captain Hook, and the children return home.
- Personal Opinion:
 - Say what you liked about Peter Pan and his adventures.
 - Choose your favourite character and explain why.
 - Describe how the story made you feel.
 - Decide if you would like to visit Neverland or fly like Peter Pan, and explain why?

❖ Year 3 Book Review Guidelines – Bowser the Hound

- Book Summary:
 - Introduce Bowser, a loyal hound who loves tracking scents.
 - Explain how chasing Old Man Coyote leads him on an unexpected adventure.
 - Mention characters like Old Man Coyote, Farmer Brown's Boy, and other woodland animals.
 - Finish by saying how Bowser finds his way home using courage and cleverness.
- Personal Opinion:
 - Say what you liked about Bowser's loyalty and determination.
 - Choose your favourite character and explain why.
 - Describe how the story made you feel.
 - Decide if you would want to join Bowser on an adventure and explain why.?

❖ Year 4 Book Review Guidelines – The Jungle Book

- Book Summary:
 - Introduce Mowgli, the boy raised by wolves.
 - Explain how Baloo and Bagheera guide him through jungle life.
 - Mention characters like Shere Khan and Kaa.
 - Finish by describing how Mowgli faces Shere Khan and discovers where he belongs.
- Personal Opinion:
 - Say what you liked about Mowgli's bravery and growth.

- Choose your favourite character and explain why.
- Describe how the story made you feel.
- Decide if you would want to live in the jungle or learn its rules, and explain why.

❖ Year 5 Book Review Guidelines – The Secret Garden

- Book Summary:
 - Introduce Mary Lennox, who moves to her uncle's manor after being orphaned.
 - Explain how she finds a locked, abandoned garden and works to bring it back to life.
 - Mention characters like Martha, Dickon, and Colin, whose lives change as the garden grows.
 - Finish by showing how the garden helps the children heal and become happier.
- Personal Opinion:
 - Say what you liked about Mary's transformation.
 - Choose your favourite character and explain why.
 - Describe how the story made you feel.
 - Decide if you would want your own secret garden and how you'd look after it.

❖ Year 6 Book Review Guidelines – Robin Hood

- Book Summary:
 - Introduce Robin Hood, the skilled outlaw who helps the poor.
 - Explain how he forms his band of Merry Men, including Little John, Friar Tuck, and Will Scarlet.
 - Mention Maid Marian and the Sheriff of Nottingham as key characters.
 - Finish by showing how Robin Hood's bravery and cleverness help him defeat injustice.
- Personal Opinion:
 - Say what you enjoyed about Robin Hood's sense of justice and adventure.
 - Choose your favourite character and explain why.
 - Describe how the story made you feel.
 - Decide if you would want to join the Merry Men and what role you might take.
